SONGS OF PRAISE

How does writing of songs and poems that express thankfulness to GOD help us rejoice in God's victory? After their deliverance from Egyptian slavery, Moses and Miriam composed songs and led the people in praising God.

- 2. Serves as a tool for Glorifying GOD.
- 3. Can be shared, taught & repeated for generations and serve as inspiration

Points of Information Songs of adoration, victory & gratitude breed faith and serve as an important reminder to all of God's Omnipresence, Promises and Omnipotence.

DEVOTIONAL READING Psalm 105 NLT ¹ Give thanks to the Lord and proclaim his greatness, Let the whole world know what he has done. ² Sing to him; yes, sing his praises. Tell everyone about his wonderful deeds.
