Title: Jonah Rejects God's Call

Text: Jonah 1:1-4,11-17, 2:1-10

Message: The Grace & Mercy of God

INTRODUCTION

God called Jonah to prophesy in Nineveh, a city of wicked people. Jonah attempted to escape from God. As a result of Jonah's disobedience, God sent a storm that impacted not only Jonah, but all the sailors around him to move Jonah into repentance and obedience.

LESSON CONTEXT

Nineveh was the capital of Assyria, an ancient ruthless nation that was a major world power for about a thousand years (1700—727 BC). Assyria had dominance in the East and Northen Israel. This was prophesied by God Through the Prophet Hosea. See Hosea 11:5,6.

References: (Isaiah 10:6; 2 Kings 18:12).

Jonah was the son of Amittai, who came from Gath-Hepher in Zebulun (Joshua 19:10-13).

Jonah was one of the minor prophets close behind Elisha in his place in the Old Testament.

Jonah was rebellious, stubborn and disobedient, he eventually repented, asked to die & grumbled.

- 2). Joppa Currently Jaffa -Tel Aviv 60 miles away.
- 3). Nineveh Capital of Assyria 500 Miles East.

JONAH 1:1-2 NIV

- 1). The word of the LORD came to Jonah son of Amittai:
- ² "Go to the great city of Nineveh and preach against it, because its wickedness has come up before me."

JONAH 1:3 NIV

³ But Jonah ran away from the LORD and headed for Tarshish. He went down to Joppa, where he found a ship bound for that port. After paying the fare, he went aboard and sailed for Tarshish to flee from the LORD.

JONAH 1:4 NIV

4 Then the LORD sent a great wind on the sea, and such a violent storm arose that the ship threatened to break up.

¹² "Pick me up and throw me into the sea," he replied, "and it will become calm. I know that it is my fault that this great storm has come upon you."

JONAH 1:13 NIV

¹³ Instead, the men did their best to row back to land. But they could not, for the sea grew even wilder than before.

JONAH 1:14 NIV

¹⁴ Then they cried out to the LORD, "Please, LORD, do not let us die for taking this man's life. Do not hold us accountable for killing an innocent man, for you, LORD, have done as you pleased."

JONAH 1:15-16 NIV

JONAH 1:17 NIV

¹ From inside the fish Jonah prayed to the LORD his God.

¹⁰ And the LORD commanded the fish, and it vomited Jonah onto dry land.
