Points of Information – Isaiah

The Book of Isaiah is quoted over sixty times in the New Testament – including by our Lord and Savior, Christ Jesus.

Isaiah's ministry spanned over 60 years. His contemporaries included Kings Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, Hezekiah and Manasseh as well as the Prophets Hosea and Micah.

Points of Information – Isaiah

The Book of Isaiah is often referred to as the “Bible in Miniature.” It has 66 Chapters while the Bible has 66 Books. Our Bible has 39 Books in the Old Testament and 27 Books in the New Testament. The Book of Isaiah can be divided into two sections as well: 39 Chapters of law, government and judgment plus 27 Chapters about the Grace and salvation of the Lord.

With much foretelling about Christ Jesus, the Book of Isaiah has been called the work of the “Fifth Evangelist” – in addition to the Gospel writers.

Points of Information – Acts

Tradition says that the Book of the Acts of the Apostles was written by Luke. Some refer to it as a Part 2 to the Gospel According to Luke.

The author's close friendship and ministerial partnership with the Apostle Paul enabled him to bear expert witness to the spread of the Gospel.

Points of Information – Acts

The second Chapter of the Book of Acts tells of how Peter's powerful preaching on a momentous Day of Pentecost led to approximately 3,000 people being saved.

The tenth Chapter of the Book of Acts illustrates the conversion of Gentiles – another element of the ministry of Peter.

Lesson Context – Isaiah 2

The First Chapter of the Book of Isaiah presents God's charges against the sinfulness of His people in Judah.

Isaiah's prophetic warnings pointed to the conquests of Assyria and Babylon.

Waiting for God's Peace

Lesson Context – Isaiah 2

The Prophet Isaiah told of how the Lord saved a remnant and that He would spare the nation if they would come back to Him.

In the beginning of Chapter 2, the prophet foretells a time of judgment and peace.

Isaiah 2:2 [NIV]

In the last days the mountain of the LORD's temple will be established as the highest of the mountains; it will be exalted above the hills, and all nations will stream to it.

Isaiah 2:3 [NIV]

Many peoples will come and say,
“Come, let us go up to the mountain of
the LORD, to the temple of the God of
Jacob.

He will teach us His ways, so that we
may walk in His paths.”

The Law will go out from Zion, the
Word of the Lord from Jerusalem.

Isaiah 2:4 [NIV]

He will judge between the nations and will settle disputes for many peoples.

They will beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks.

Nation will not take up sword against nation, nor will they train for war anymore.

Waiting for God's Peace

Lesson Context – Acts 17

23

Earlier in this Chapter, “Paul and his companions” journeyed to and through Thessalonica and Berea to Athens.

In Athens, the Apostle Paul faced and preached to a highly educated audience.

Lesson Context – Acts 17

24

Paul was taken to the meeting place of the aristocratic judicial council – the Areopagus.

There, he refuted the “unknown god” and preached about God, the Father.

Acts 17:26 [NIV]

“From one man He made all the nations, that they should inhabit the whole earth; and He marked out their appointed times in history and the boundaries of their lands.

Acts 17:27 [NIV]

God did this so that they would seek Him and perhaps reach out for Him and find Him, though He is not far from any one of us.

Acts 17:28 [NIV]

‘For in Him we live and move and have our being.’

As some of your own poets have said,
‘We are His offspring.’

Remember These Things:

The Lord has promised peace for us.

Foretelling the birth of Christ Jesus, Isaiah said that He would be called the Prince of Peace. Isaiah 9:6.

As true Christians, let us be practitioners thereof.

Remember These Things:

Our God is omnipotent, omniscient, and omnipresent.

He is all powerful, all knowing, and ever present.

Let us pray and worship Him always.
