- Jesus crucified on the cross at Calvary Matt: 27:32-44
- Jesus body was laid in A tomb sealed by a large stone.
- Roman soldiers were assigned to guard the tomb.
- A Great Earthquake, an Angel & Jesus Arose.
- The Mary's were the last and the first witnesses

Matthew 28: 1 NRSV

1 After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb.

Matthew 28:2 NRSV

² And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it.

Matthew 28:3, 4 NRSV

³ His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. ⁴ For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men.

Matthew 28:5, 6 NRSV

⁵ But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. ⁶ He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay.

Matthew 28: 7 NRSV

⁷Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you."

Matthew 28:8,9 NRSV 8 So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. 9 Suddenly Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came

to him, took hold of his feet, and

worshiped him.

Matthew 28:10,11 NRSV

Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me."

While they were going, some of the guard went into the city and told the chief priests everything that had happened
