Lesson Title: Fasting & Praying

Lesson Text Ezra 8:21-23 ESV

Devotional Reading Ezra: 7, 8

2 Chronicles 7:12–18

INTRODUCTION

In today's passage, Ezra moves from a prophetic role to a leadership role. After proclaiming God's protection, Ezra led the people in prayer and fasting to ensure their safety in the return to their homeland. Typically, the Persians would have provided military escort for Ezra as they were carrying with them monetary contributions made by the Persians. Apparently, however, the Persian king had been convinced of God's protection for the returning exiles.

LESSON CONTEXT

The Temple has been restored, Ezra & company are now preparing for the journey from Babylon to Jerusalem. They have a long trip and are carrying valued treasures through dangerous territory. Although King Artaxerxes promised Ezra anything he desired for this trip. Ezra seeks the provision and protection of the Lord and calls for spiritual leaders to pray with Him and the tribes before their departure instead of going to the King, whom Ezra previously told God's Got It!

²¹ There, by the Ahava Canal, I proclaimed a fast, so that we might humble ourselves before our God and ask him for a safe journey for us and our children, with all our possessions.
