Aim for Change

- 1. EXPLORE: The purpose for which God has called you.
- 2. TRUST: God has a significant plan for our lives.
- 3. PRAY: FOR CLEAR UNDERSTANDING OF God's assignment (for me).
- 4. Stand firm in faith, hope, and love, always being ready for Christ's return.

Introduction

- Unfortunately, some Christians and non-Christians have attempted to set dates regarding Christ's return:
- *No one knows the "day or hour" (Matt.
- 24:36; Mk. 13:32).
- *We must be actively involved in carrying out the Great Commission (Matt. 28:19).
- *We were saved to do good. Titus 3:1-11

Word Study:

- Deceived = cause someone to believe something that is not true.
- Apostasy = abandonment of or renunciation of religious or political belief (rebellion)
- Persecution = difficulties that come to the Christian church and to individual Christians because of their discipleship and commitment to Jesus Christ.

Lesson Objective:

- A. Deception knows no Boundaries 2 Thess. 2:1-3
- 1. deception (deceived)= cause someone to believe something that is not true, typically in order to gain personal advantage.
 - 2. This is a very young church, and young Christians, although committed, they had not progressed and matured in their faith.

- The Thessalonians had been told by false teachers that the Day of the Lord had already come and that they had missed it.
- Paul, in his epistle writes to them to let them know that the Lord had not returned. Do not let anyone deceive you.
- They questioned themselves because some have become rebellious and began to fall away.

- B. WE Must Love the Truth or Else Be Deceived 2 Thess. 2:9-11
- Lawless one will perform signs and wonders and display great power.
- Before the Day of the Lord comes, evil will worsen, and a man who represents Satan will emerge, working false miracles, signs, and wonders.
- How will we recognize these false signs?

- C. We escape deception through Faith 2 Thess. 2:13-15 a
- God has poured out His grace on those of us who believe. We did not choose Him, but He first chose us (John 15:16).
- From the beginning, God chose us to salvation through sanctification of the Spirit and belief in the truth
- With God's help, we can "stand firm" no matter what happens on this earth (2 Thess. 2:15)

Summary

- Christ will come, and we are to be ready.
- We must be actively involved in carrying out the Great Commission
- The more we help Christians grow in faith, hope, and love, the more they will be ready for Christ's return.
- Jesus offers us eternal life. He offers discipleship, relationship, and His abiding promise to be with us always, even until the end. You must know Him for yourself.
