Title: The Temple Rebuilt
Text: Haggai 1:1-4, 7-10, 12-15

BACKGROUND

Haggai's prophecy came at a time when the people of Judah were extremely vulnerable. After the exile from Babylon, they were hopeful in returning to Jerusalem, yet challenges in rebuilding temple caused construction to cease. (Ezra 4:24).



BACKGROUND

Sixteen years later, Haggai Points out the misplaced priorities, economic distress & the failure to rebuild the temple. The Jews were receptive to his message of rebuilding the Lord's house.

- 2). About only 50 fifty- thousand people returned. (Ezra 2:64)
- 3). They were anxious to rebuild and soon became discouraged.

In the second year of King Darius, on the first day of the sixth month, the word of the LORD came through the prophet Haggai to Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, and to Joshua, son of Jozadak, the high priest:



HAGGAI 1:2-3 NIV

2. This is what the LORD Almighty says: "These people say, 'The time has not yet come to rebuild the LORD's house." 3. Then the word of the LORD came through the prophet



HAGGAI 1:4-5 NIV

4"Is it a time for you yourselves to be living in your paneled houses, while this house remains a ruin?" 5. Now this is what the LORD Almighty says: "Give careful thought to your

ways.

HAGGAI 1:6 NIV

6. You have planted much but harvested little. You eat, but never have enough. You drink, but never have your fill. You put on clothes but are not warm. You earn wages, only to put them in a purse with holes in it."



HAGGAI 1:7 NIV

7. This is what the LORD Almighty says:

"Give careful thought to your ways.

8. Go up into the mountains and bring down timber and build my house, so that I may take pleasure in it and be honored," says the Lord.

9"You expected much, but see, it turned out to be little. What you brought home, I blew away. Why?" declares the Lord Almighty. "Because of my house, which remains a ruin, while each of you is busy with your own

10. Therefore, because of you the heavens have withheld their dew and the earth its crops.



HAGGAI 1:12 NIV

12. Then Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel, Joshua son of Jozadak, the high priest, and the whole remnant of the people obeyed the voice of the LORD their God and the message of the prophet Haggai, because the LORD their God had sent him. And the people feared the LORD



HAGGAI 1:13 NIV III

13. Then Haggai, the Lord's messenger, gave this message of the Lord to the people: "I am with you," declares the Lord.



HAGGAI 1:14 NIV

14. So the LORD stirred up the spirit of Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, and the spirit of Joshua son of Jozadak, the high priest, and the spirit of the whole remnant of the people. They came and began to work on the house of the LORD Almighty, their God,

HAGGAI 1:15 NIV

15 on the twenty-fourth day of the sixth month.

God used the Prophet Haggai to challenge, & encourage the exiles to change their ways & start rebuilding the Temple. Taking care of Gods house benefits the Church communities, cities, states, nations and the World.
