Points of Information – Amos

Amos was a shepherd from the town of Tekoa in Judah. Amos 1:1; 7:14, 15.

Amos was a contemporary of Jonah, Hosea and Isaiah.

Amos prophesied in the days of Kings Jeroboam II (Israel) and Uzziah (Judah).

Points of Information – Amos

Although Amos was a native of the Southern Kingdom of Judah, he prophesied primarily in and to the Northern Kingdom of Israel.

Following the directives of the Lord, Amos declared particular judgment on the people for their hypocritical worship and their harsh treatment of the poor.

Points of Information – Amos

Amos spoke of why and how the Lord God would punish sin.

Amos predicted the captivity of the Israelites and (in general) where it would occur.

Amos 5:14-15 [NLT]

Do what is good and run from evil so that you may live! Then the Lord God of Heaven's Armies will be your helper, just as you have claimed.

Hate evil and love what is good; turn your courts into true halls of justice. Perhaps even yet the Lord God of Heaven's Armies will have mercy on the remnant of His people.

Instead, I want to see a mighty flood of justice, an endless river of righteous living. [KJV: But let justice flow like water and righteousness, like an unfailing stream.]

“Was it me you were bringing sacrifices and offerings during the forty years in the wilderness, Israel?”

No, you served your pagan gods – Sakkuth your king god and Kaiwan your star god – the images you made for yourselves.

Amos 5:27

So I will send you into exile, to a land east of Damascus," says the Lord, whose Name is the God of Heaven's Armies.

Remember these things:

Let's keep it real in our worship and service for the Lord.

The Lord is pleased when we are genuine in what we do for Him.
